LOGOS SCHOLARS REFRESHED AGAIN

Andreas Gemeinde Church gave a second benevolence donation to the Logos Scholarship Fund. This went a long way to ensure that our scholars and their families had food, medical supplies and data bundles to allow the scholars continue with their online classes.

IMPACT OF COVID-19 IN KENYA

1. SOCIAL ECONOMIC

Kenya has the highest number of recorded cases of Covid-19 in East Africa. Despite various confinement measures, infection numbers continue to rise. Currently, the impact and spread of infections are feared to be exacerbated by the huge number of people living in poverty; a weak health infrastructure; overcrowding in informal settlements; and poor access to basic services such as clean water, sanitation and hygiene.

The government is undertaking various measures to curb the spread of the virus, including limiting movement in places with reported cases; closure of public spaces with high human traffic, such as schools and public events; dusk-to-dawn curfews; and ensuring basic hygiene and social distancing.

However, these precautionary measures continue to have negative economic impacts on businesses and workers. The country has witnessed job cuts across various sectors, and incomes of businesses and available working hours for staff have fallen significantly. People living in poverty are finding it difficult to meet their daily expenses and pay bills, including rent. Kenyans, particularly those relying on casual work, find it difficult to pay rent.

2. POLITICAL

On 4th November the President announced an extension of nationwide COVID-19 curfew till Jan. 3, 2021, and banned political rallies for

60 days as infections had surged over the last month. This has meant that political gatherings have drastically reduced, helping to reduce the number of Covid-19 infections.

3. EDUCATION SECTOR

All learning institutions were closed in March to curb the spread of the virus. In September the Ministry of Health report said that the transmission rate had gone down to below 5%. The Ministry of Education introduced the gradual re-opening of schools where in the first phase the candidates in high school (form 4), primary (class 8) and grade 4 went back to school in October.

The second phase was to have all the other learners report 2 weeks after, however due to a rise in the infection rates, the government postponed the reopening to 4th January 2021. However, when schools reopened there were a few infections in some schools. We thank God that the infection rate in schools has gone down and we are hopeful that the other learners will resume school in January.

The learners have continued to the second term of the school calendar since they had already covered the first term curriculum in March.

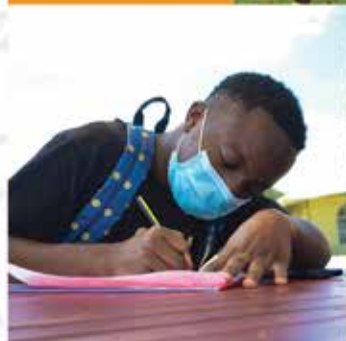
