# *A New Partnership, A Shared Vision*



In January, the Logos Scholarship Fund entered into a strategic partnership with KCB Foundation that will significantly expand access to secondary education for vulnerable learners.

Through this collaboration, 100 scholars will be enrolled annually - 50 supported by the Logos Scholarship Fund and 50 by the KCB Foundation.

On 15th January, we officially flagged off the first cohort of scholars under this partnership. The event marked the formal commencement of a shared

commitment: to ensure that financial hardship does not determine a child's future.

*This partnership is, for us, answered prayer. We have long trusted God to expand our reach sustainably; to move beyond limitation without compromising the heart of the Fund.*

Through this collaboration, we see provision meeting vision, and faith meeting opportunity. We are grateful for partners who believe in long-term transformation and who stand with us in our mission to Educate for Life and Eternity.

# *Daniel Kenyansa*

*Daniel is only 16 years old, but his journey reflects a resilience far beyond his years.*

He lost his father 12 years ago, and his mother, widowed and raising 7 children, carried stones and sand at construction sites for over a decade to keep her children afloat. There were seasons when she worked for 24 hours straight, sometimes up to three days with minimal rest simply to provide the basics for her family.

Over time, the strain took its toll. Her health declined, and for the past two years she has been largely unable to work. The family's situation became increasingly dire, causing instability in Daniel's academic situation due to unpaid fees. To support himself and his mother, he chopped firewood, fetched water for neighbours, and took on any manual job he could find.





Since completing Junior High School, Daniel has also become a caregiver; managing household responsibilities and accompanying his mother in search of small jobs when her strength allows. Today, they are housed by a well-wisher.

In the midst of these challenges, Daniel scored 54 out of 72 points in the Kenya Junior School Assessment. He had quietly begun to accept that his education might end there; but now through the Logos Scholarship Fund, Daniel was able to enroll in Grade 10 this year. He now has stability, structure, and a renewed dream to become a journalist.

His story reminds us that behind every scholarship is not just a student, but a family with the resolve to survive and a future waiting to unfold.

60% qualified for university.  
40% qualified for diploma, craft certificate, and artisan courses in TVET institutions. Each pathway represents progress, dignity, and a life moving forward.

One of our top performers, Ruth Nyamisa, who earned an A- in her exams, has chosen to serve the very program that once supported her.

Ruth now participates in scholar onboarding through home visits to applicants' homes. This process has given her a deeper appreciation for what it takes to assess genuine need, understanding living conditions, family dynamics, and the quiet realities many families face.

Through this experience, she has developed administrative skills, report-writing competence, objectivity, teamwork, and endurance. The distances travelled during visits and the weight of the stories encountered have shaped her perspective.



As she prepares to pursue medicine, Ruth carries not only academic excellence but also compassion and responsibility. She has experienced support, and now she seeks to become part of someone else's breakthrough.

This reflects the true ripple effect of sponsorship where those who have been supported are inspired not only to succeed, but to return, serve, and actively participate in creating opportunities for others.

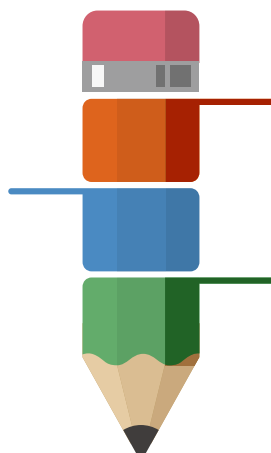
