Micah Kegode joined the Logos Scholarship Fund as a Form One in 2023. Not long after, his journey took an unexpected turn; he was diagnosed with cancer.

Much of his school life became a balance between hospital visits and classroom work. Yet, even in those difficult seasons, Micah remained remarkably steady, consistently posting excellent academic performance.

Through the rhythms of the Logos daily devotionals, Micah found strength on the days when hope felt distant. And through the presence of a faithful mentor, he was never alone. He was encouraged, supported, and walked

with through every step.

Along this journey, Micah made the most important decision of his life: he gave his life to Christ and was baptized.

Today, Micah is cancer-free. He is a leader in his school, serving as a dormitory captain, and is now in Form Four preparing for his KCSE exams later this year. While he continues to regain full health after recent challenges, his dream remains clear - to become a pediatric oncologist.

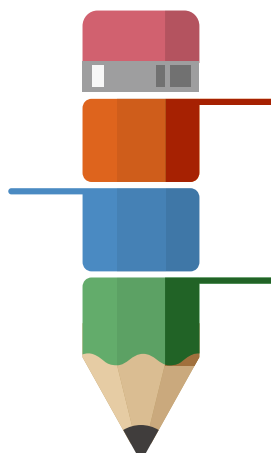
